

2026 LIVERY PRICING SURVEY FINDINGS

In December 2025, we surveyed a cross-section of livery yard owners and managers across the UK to establish average prices for a range of livery packages and associated services. This research builds on a smaller but comparable survey carried out in December 2023, allowing us to assess how pricing has changed over time as well as to identify current national and regional trends.

In the results that follow, we present the average, highest and lowest prices submitted for each livery category. These figures are based on what are generally understood to be standard provisions and services typically included within each package. However, given the significant variation in facilities, inclusions, locations and individual business models, these figures should be viewed as indicative and taken at face value, with the understanding that higher or lower costs may be driven by these differences.

Towards the end of the report, we break the data down further into regional pricing, highlighting variations from the national average and comparing results directly with the 2023 survey. All findings and analysis are provided for reference only and are based on responses received over a two-week period across our platforms and wider network.






When did you last increase the prices of your livery packages?

CONCLUSION

This survey provides an updated overview of livery pricing across the UK as of December 2025, allowing comparison with our previous survey conducted in January 2023. It is positive to see a considerable increase in prices across most livery packages since the last survey, reflecting a reaction by yard owners to the growing pressures of rising operating costs. Encouragingly, many respondents indicated that they have already reviewed their prices within the last 2 years, and plan to do so again within the next 12 months, suggesting a proactive and sustainable approach to pricing within the sector.

While there are some regional differences in pricing, most notably lower average costs in Wales, average livery prices across the regions of the UK are generally consistent. However, for some packages there is a wide variation between the minimum and maximum charges reported. This could be attributed to a range of factors, including differences in facilities, inclusions, location, on-site advantages such as access to professional riders or coaches, and individual pricing structures. However, these results clearly demonstrate that yards are able to operate sustainably at the higher end of the pricing spectrum.

Almost 40% of respondents stated that they had reviewed their services, packages, or overall operations in the last 12 months, which would indicate proactive changes to improve business viability, to diversify or develop their operations to create new business opportunities or income streams, or altering packages such as removing ad-lib hay and bedding or reducing other inclusions to make outgoings more consistent given the large price increases some of these provisions have faced in recent times.

At LiveryList, we are committed to supporting yard owners, managers and the wider equestrian community by improving transparency and access to meaningful data. To our knowledge, no other UK-wide survey of this kind has been conducted to provide insight into average livery pricing and associated services. Further investigation would be valuable to better understand profit margins, the relationship between package pricing and operating costs, and what constitutes long-term sustainability for livery businesses. We hope these findings help yard owners feel more confident in reviewing and adjusting their prices, planning for future costs, and navigating an increasingly challenging economic environment.
